History:

Originally build as Harry and Elsie Mercer's home during the 1940's, Harry Mercer came to Ubobo via Brisbane from England. He and his family (wife & 4 daughters), first lived on the banks of The Ten Mile (now Ridler Ck) before living in a cabin and then building a home and a shop close to this site. After the home was eaten out by white ants, Harry built this home with instructions from his wife Elsie to include a bay window, he wasn't sure how to build one but figured it out as you can see, They also ran a general store on the site. The Mercers eventually sold out and Jack and Pearl Mossman lived here for some years and ran the shop before selling to my grandparents Les and Susannah (May) Pownall in 1955 so Follywood has been home to my family twice. Les and May had moved from the family property 'Stockwell' to allow their son Brian and his family to take over the running of the property, during their time here, I as the eldest grandchild, enjoyed many happy times with my grandparents, May was a great cook and I can remember helping Grandma bake in the old kitchen on the wood stove and enjoying the spoils afterwards. Les and May moved to Gladstone in 1964 due to May's ill health and Charlie and May Hammond purchased the home. They had retired from their dairy farm 'Saddllevale' and lived here for many years during which time Charlie built the stables to house his race horse Wee Willie Whistle with whom he had some success. After Charlie's death, May moved to Gladstone and the property was purchased by Merv and Rhonda Ware who lived here before moving to their property on Tableland Road, Rhonda has since returned to Ubobo and lives across the road, Cindy Wright was the next owner and with her mother's gardening skills, began establishing some of the gardens here today. In 2006 I purchased the property which had been rented for a few years and began the restoration of the home which had fallen into some disrepair.

I had always had in my mind that it would be a great B&B as my grandmother's sister Elvie, would often stay here when I was a child and her room was the front room with the bay window, so I always thought of it as a guest room rather than the master.

Finally fulfilling my dream to open the room to guests will mean that many of you can enjoy the relaxing features of Follywood and the Boyne Valley that I have been enjoying for the past 10 years. I welcome you and hope that you enjoy your stay and please let me know if you need anything .
